Please could we remind you that, if your child is off with sickness and/or diarrhoea, they should stay at home for 48 hours following their final episode of illness.

Parking

This term, we have had a few enquiries and comments from both local residents and families of the school regarding the parking situation. We are aware that parking for any school is often problematic and as a large school this is even more the case for us. The school has recently spent money on extending the car park area, which families may park in, but there are currently no plans (or available finances) to extend this further. Please can we remind you to be considerate to our local residents when parking on the local roads and ensure that you do not block driveways or entrances and exits to school. If you enter the school car park, please do so carefully and slowly to prevent any accidents with pedestrians or other vehicles. Also, please ensure you only park in designated areas.

We would like to remind you that we have two gate entrances for entering the school grounds on foot. The back gate is opened at the same time as the front gate and this entrance can be accessed from the pathway just past the school as you walk down Garden Lane. This could mean that there may be other places to park which are more convenient for this entrance and thus alleviate some of the parking and queuing directly outside the school. This situation will be kept under review and thank you to all the families who support these procedures to help keep everyone safe.
