## SuDS (Sustainable Drainage Systems) in Schools Project

Our school has been approached to take part in a fully funded project by Anglian Water. working in partnership with the DFE and Suffolk County Council's Flood and Water Management Team. We are one of four schools to have been chosen to take part in this scheme.

This project will involve a drainage system on the field which will be supplying the environmental pond with water and an exciting project in our Key Stage 1 courtyard.





We are very excited to announce that we have been awarded a small grant to develop a wellbeing and reflective garden on the school grounds. There will be three main areas of the garden. One area will focus on promoting calm and relaxation, the central area will be a living



memory tree and the final area will be an active zone. All classes will be able to use the space

to support their learning, and children will be able to access it at break and lunchtimes. Mrs Jennings is leading on this project and asks if there are any parents, companies or tradespeople that would like to support this project. This could be through parents/carers offering time to help with planting, companies offering sponsorship to help with the overall cost or tradespeople who can support with the building of some of the structures. #### Mental Health Awareness Week

Last week, each class took part in a Mindfulness workshop. During these workshops the children learnt more about what mental health is and practised techniques they can use to help look after their mental health and wellbeing. These included superhero poses, breathing buddies and relaxation.

This week, the children have learnt about the innate needs that we all have and the importance of having these needs met. Each class has spent time developing their mental health awareness, taking part in lots of activities and learning about how to talk about their emotions using 'Zones of Regulation'.

More information about these techniques and how you can support your child's mental health and wellbeing has been sent out in a separate letter.




#### World Book Day
