Curriculum Overview – Spring Term 1 2023

Class Name: Blackbirds / Owls / Eagles

Topic: The Titanic

Year Group: 5 / 6



English

Journal entries / narrative writing , travel brochures / persuasive writing

The children will consolidate their skills of sentence construction using a variety of grammatical techniques across different genres. The children's writing style will reflect the intended audience of the text.

History / Geography

Titanic / Rivers

The children will learn about the significance of the different events which led to the sinking of the Titanic. They will analyse and evaluate different types of evidence.

The children will develop their knowledge of the vocabulary and processes linked to the river system and the water cycle.

Maths

Ratio / Algebra / Decimals / Percentages / Shape, Space and Measures

The children will deepen their understanding of fractions through their relationship with decimals and percentages. They will identify patterns between quantities when studying ratio and create algebraic statements to satisfy a range of number sequences.

PSHE / RSHE / Art /

Textiles: Children will investigate and reform visual and tactile qualities using construction and destruction processes. They will use both natural and man-made materials to produce a multi-media weaving.

'Hopes and dreams'

Children will identify their personal goals in and out of school and recognise their personal achievements.

Homework and how you can help at home:

In general, the children will be set weekly grammar, comprehension, spelling and maths homework. The Eagles, Owls and Blackbirds completion dates will vary depending on their individual timetables.

We would like to encourage your parental support when necessary with your child's homework as this will help them in their preparation for the year 6 SAT's. The children are expected to read daily for 10-minutes, this can be across a range of texts including magazines, newspaper articles, non-fiction texts. Science

The Human Body

The children will explore the role of the heart and the circulatory system. In addition, they will learn about how our knowledge and understanding of the heart has changed throughout history. The children will also develop their research skills to find out more about

research skills to find out more about famous scientists from the past.

Technology – Computing / DT

The children will be developing their learning on how to keep themselves safe online. The children will identify the differences and similarities between bullying and cyber-bullying. They will learn how to find information to help keep them safe online.

The children will design and make a moving toy that uses a 'cam' mechanism.

RE

Hinduism / Moksha

Children will learn that there is more than one pathway to reach the top and each individual's pathway may differ but the end point is the same.

MFL

The children will follow the 'Hola Espanol' scheme to further their knowledge in reading and speaking Spanish.

PE

The children will participate in net / court games and develop their skills and techniques whilst playing Tchoukball.

Music

This term the children will be looking at Benjamin Britten's Storm at sea music and composing their own sea storm pieces to tie in with the Titanic work.
