Year3/4 Trip to the Farm and Country Fair, Ipswich



Lower Key Stage 2 had a fantastic day at the Suffolk Schools' Farm and Country Fair. The day began with many of the children participating in various conservation activities like how a cricket bat is made; how bees make honey; and how to plant a hedgerow. We then took a tractor ride to the next destination.
Some pupils then looked at how sausages are made; how bread is made; and then they extracted the DNA from a strawberry. After this we all went to the livestock area where we were allowed to observe and stroke a range of animals.
During the lunch break, we watched a horse and hound show followed by watching some wonderful sheep dogs in action. Then after lunch some of the group learned some CPR techniques with the air ambulance crew which was very exciting; and we asked lots of questions to the pilot. We later saw the air ambulance take off and some of us even were blown over by the wind produced by the helicopter.
Another group of children looked at some farm machinery including a baler and a combine harvester whilst others watched a sheep show. One class went to meet the police and sniffer dogs and got the chance to ask lots of questions. Finally, we were so lucky at the end of the day as we all met Sophie, the Duchess of Edinburgh! She even had a conversation with some of our party.
On behalf of all of the staff, a huge well done to all the children on the trip for listening to all of the adults and making our school proud of them.
