Year 5/6 Trip to Dunwich



On Thursday 22nd
June, the Year 5
and 6 pupils
embarked on a
historical journey to
the "lost village" of
Dunwich.







The children had the opportunity to transfer their learning from the classroom to the natural environment. Coastal factors and processes, including erosion, longshore drift, bays and beaches were explored. The dissolution of the monasteries, along with the disappearance of the medieval town of Dunwich, were another area of study. The day was rounded off with some beach art inspired by Andy Goldsworthy, and an ice cream on the pebbles.
